Get to Gates! The Best Option for Stroke Treatment

Stroke remains the third leading cause of death in the United States, particularly in the Western New York region. Although stroke symptoms are an emergency, not every hospital emergency room is equipped to respond effectively – so getting treated at the right hospital in the first critical hours may be the difference between significant impairment and returning to an active lifestyle.



Some strokes are treated with medications that must be given within six hours of the first signs of a stroke. Other strokes may require surgical treatment. The regionally-designated Kaleida Stroke Care Center at Millard Fillmore Gates Circle Hospital provides both through a nationally-recognized stroke team that is available around-the-clock.

This session will focus on the extensive options for stroke treatment available at the Kaleida Stroke Care Center, including minimally-invasive stroke treatments not offered anywhere else in the region.

Empower yourself with knowledge of stroke symptoms, learn how to reduce your risk of stroke and minimize the threat of stroke by being aware of your best option for treatment.

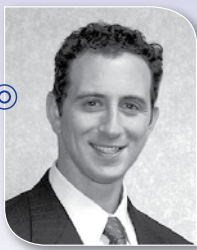
L.N. Hopkins, M.D.
