Sonya S. Noor, MD, FACS, of Buffalo Vascular and Endovascular Surgical Associates, has extensive experience delivering highly skilled care in the area of endovascular surgery. Dr. Noor was granted admission to the prestigious Calcutta Medical College (India) in 1992 at the young age of 17. She soon discovered her true calling in medicine and graduated with honors in surgery, a focus she pursued by moving to the United States to explore opportunities. After completing research as a Fellow in the Department of Cardio-thoracic surgery at the Medical University of South Carolina, Charleston in 1995, Dr. Noor started her general surgery residency at the State University at New York (SUNY) Syracuse. In 2004 Dr. Noor completed an endovascular Fellowship at the Arizona Heart Institute in Phoenix, Arizona.

Dr. Noor is affiliated with Buffalo General Hospital, Millard Fillmore Gates Circle Hospital and Millard Fillmore Suburban Hospital. In 2008 NHL player Richard Zednik, 32, suffered an arterial laceration during a Buffalo Sabres-Florida Panthers game at HSBC Arena in Buffalo, NY. Dr. Noor — who performed the lifesaving surgery on the athlete at Buffalo General — received world-wide acclaim at the time for her skill and expertise. She is a clinical associate professor for the State University of New York at Buffalo (UB), Department of Surgery; a member of the American Medical Association, Eastern Vascular Society, and currently serves as president-elect for the Western New York Vascular Society.
